FROM THE CHAIR



This year has been defined by connection, collaboration, and a renewed sense of momentum within the Caltech postdoctoral community. Coming out of the disruptions of the pandemic era, the Caltech Postdoctoral Association (CPA) worked to rebuild traditions, introduce new initiatives, and strengthen the support structures that enable postdocs to thrive—both personally and professionally.

Across campus, CPA volunteers organized more than fifty events spanning career development, community outreach, advocacy, wellness, and social engagement. We expanded our career programming with workshops on chalk talks, networking, grant writing, and funding landscapes; grew the Postdoc Launch Seminar Series to 17 talks across multiple venues; revived STEM for Families; and supported postdocs navigating the academic job market. A record number of attendees participated throughout the year, reflecting the growing demand for meaningful professional support and connection.

We also recommitted to service. In January, the Wildfire Relief Donation and Pickup Center demonstrated what our community can accomplish together, transforming an empty space into a hub of compassion in just hours. Initiatives like this remind us that our impact extends well beyond research, reaching families across Pasadena and Altadena.

Celebrations remained central to building belonging. This year's Postdoc Appreciation Week brought hundreds of postdocs together to share meals, conversation, and community. Social programming—from hiking trips to comedy nights—helped create moments of rest and joy between experiments, proposals, and late-night data analysis.

And once again, Explore Caltech welcomed thousands of visitors to experience hands-on science, TED-style talks, and the infectious excitement of discovery. Seeing families return year after year has been a powerful reminder of our role as ambassadors of curiosity.

None of this would have been possible without the dedication of our volunteer committees, division representatives, campus partners, and the postdocs who consistently show up—to teach, to organize, to cheer, to build. Your energy and generosity are what make this community extraordinary.

As we look ahead, our focus remains clear: support the success, wellbeing, and visibility of Caltech's postdoctoral scholars. Thank you for your creativity, your compassion, and your commitment to one another. It is an honor to serve as Chair, and I am excited for the discoveries—scientific and human—that the year ahead will bring.

WILDFIRE RELIEF




In response to the devastating wildfires that impacted our region, the Caltech Postdoctoral Association coordinated a community-wide Wildfire Relief Donation and Pickup Center that operated from January 11 to 26. What began as a small table outside Caltech Hall quickly evolved into a fully stocked relief hub inside Red Door Café, thanks to the overwhelming generosity of our Caltech community.

Over two weeks, hundreds of donated items—from clothing and household goods to children's supplies—were distributed to those affected. Every time a call for specific items went out, donations arrived within hours, reflecting the compassion and solidarity that define our campus.

In addition to directly supporting displaced families, some items were donated to a local elementary school, which in turn used them to raise funds for wildfire relief efforts benefiting affected community members. Remaining children's items (newborn through age 10) were rehomed to the Caltech Women's Club Casita (234 S. Catalina Ave, Pasadena) in partnership with the Caltech International Spouses Club, where they continue to serve families in need year-round.

This initiative was made possible by the collaboration and volunteerism of members from CPA, GSC, ASCIT, CWC, and CISC, who collectively sorted, organized, and distributed thousands of items. We are deeply grateful to all who gave their time and donations—and to postdoc Lara Krisst, who created denastrong.info, a resource hub for wildfire-affected families in the Pasadena–Altadena area.

Together, our community turned compassion into action and made a lasting impact.




2025 LA PRIDE PARADE




STEM FOR **FAMILIES**

STEM for Families is a monthly outreach program that brings postdoc families together for hands-on scientific discovery. Revived this year after a hiatus during the pandemic, the program has quickly regained momentum and enthusiasm within the community. Each session features a fun, interactive activity led by a Caltech volunteer, introducing children to concepts across math, chemistry, biology, physics, engineering, and computer science through playful experimentation.

This year, the program continued to grow in popularity, with approximately 20–30 families attending each of the six sessions offered. Volunteer instructors led engaging activities across a wide range of topics including food science, turbulent flows, infrared cameras, extracting DNA from fruit, building electric motors and making hydrogels.

By fostering curiosity, creativity, and community, STEM for Families has become a cherished monthly event for young learners and parents alike.




POSTDOC LAUNCH

The Postdoc Launch Seminar Series was established to spotlight the research achievements of Caltech postdoctoral scholars and support the development of strong presentation skills in a professional, community-focused setting. Running bi-weekly from May through October, this year's series featured 17 seminars, each led by a postdoc sharing their latest work with peers across all divisions. Graduate students occasionally attended as well, fostering broader interdisciplinary discussion.

Speakers delivered 20-minute presentations followed by audience Q&A, highlighting both technical depth and accessibility. To support professional growth, presenters could opt in to receive anonymous, QR-based feedback on delivery and clarity. Ahead of their seminars, speakers provided a short bio, portrait, talk title, and abstract—elements that helped showcase the diversity of research directions and career paths represented within the postdoctoral community.

Events were held in various locations across campus, providing greater accessibility to the broader community. As an initiative created by postdocs, for postdocs, the Postdoc Launch Seminar Series continues to grow as a platform for celebrating scholarship, elevating emerging voices, and preparing researchers for the next stage of their careers.



CAREER EVENTS

This year, the CPA expanded its portfolio of career-focused programming to support postdocs preparing for the next stage of their professional journeys. Through workshops, panels, and seminars, participants gained practical guidance on academic job applications, funding strategies, communication skills, and career transitions—while connecting with mentors and peers across campus.

Among the many events offered this year, several highlights included:

- A panel featuring five newly appointed Caltech assistant professors, who offered candid perspectives on navigating the academic job market and answered questions on dossier preparation, interviewing, networking, and balancing research priorities.
- A dedicated chalk talk workshop led by Prof. Dianne Newman, providing strategies for structuring compelling proposals and handling real-time scientific questions during faculty interviews.
- A résumé workshop with Enrica Bruno, patent attorney at Steinfl + Bruno, LLP, focused on translating research experience into industry-relevant language and strengthening application materials.



- A funding seminar with Dr. Nelly Khidekel, Executive Director for Foundation Relations at Caltech, offering insights into philanthropic funding pathways, proposal positioning, donor expectations, and campus resources.
- A LinkedIn workshop hosted in partnership with CALE, guiding postdocs through effective online professional branding, networking best practices, and how to leverage the platform for recruiting and career discovery.
- A grant writing workshop with Dr. Ariane Helou, offering strategies for sharpening research aims, structuring persuasive narratives, and aligning proposals with reviewer expectations.
- A networking seminar with nationally recognized career coach Dr. Marty Nemko, who shared actionable approaches to relationship-building, informational interviewing, and communicating professional value.

These were just a few of the career development opportunities offered throughout the year. Collectively, the CPA's programming equipped postdocs with practical tools, professional confidence, and insider perspectives as they prepare to enter a highly competitive global job market.






POSTDOC APPRECIATION **WEEK**

EXPLORE CALTECH

Explore Caltech 2025: A Day of Discovery, Curiosity, and Community

Under a bright Pasadena sky, the Caltech campus came alive on Saturday, October 11, as more than 2,000 visitors—families, students, alumni, and science enthusiasts—gathered for the annual Explore Caltech celebration. Organized by the Caltech Postdoctoral Association, this campus-wide outreach event transformed Beckman Mall into a vibrant festival of science, creativity, and connection.

Back and Better Than Ever

This year marked the second Explore Caltech since its post-pandemic reboot, and the excitement was unmistakable. After a multi-year haitus, the return of hands-on science and in-person talks has reignited a sense of community across campus. The crowds reflected a growing appetite for learning and engagement—with many families returning for a second year, eager to see what new experiments, talks, and discoveries awaited them.

Inspiring Minds Through Science

Throughout the day, visitors filled lecture halls for 12 TED-style talks by Caltech researchers and postdocs. These dynamic presentations showcased cutting-edge science—from decoding the brain's neural networks to exploring distant galaxies—through engaging storytelling that connected with audiences of all ages.

“These talks really capture what Caltech is about,” one attendee remarked. “You can feel the excitement of discovery in every speaker.”

Interactive Booths Spark Curiosity

Outside, Beckman Mall buzzed with energy as guests explored 20 interactive science booths spanning every Caltech Division. Children launched rockets, peered through microscopes, experimented with polymers, and learned how physics, chemistry, and biology shape the world around us. Each booth was designed and staffed by postdoctoral scholars and graduate students eager to share their passion for discovery.

One parent shared, “My daughter and her friend really enjoyed it and actively participated in the booths. Her favorite fact was learning that the aurora borealis is actually plasma!”

Moments like these captured the essence of Explore Caltech—making science tangible, exciting, and deeply personal.





A Celebration of Curiosity and Connection

Beyond the experiments and lectures, Explore Caltech was about bringing people together. Food trucks, live music, and student performances added a festive atmosphere as families, researchers, and community members mingled and shared stories. For many attendees, the event served as both a celebration of science and a reminder of Caltech's role as a beacon of innovation and outreach.
